In the Garden

As our strawberry harvest slows, raspberries, blueberries & blackberries are ripening. Our pea plants will be composted at the beginning of the month but the children will continue to help plant pole beans in their place. Our first bush & pole beans have sprouted and we will fill in empty spaces with more seeds. Most of our corn plants have sprouted and we'll plant more pole beans between the corn plants. New Zealand spinach is growing well and the children will be sampling these during garden classes or on the playgrounds. Our flower gardens are blooming nicely and we will continue enjoy new flowers (and pollinators) as summer goes on. We will be continuing to harvest garlic & oregano this month: please keep your eyes out for some by the front door to take home; the kiddos love to take things home from the gardens. We will also be looking for young kale & lettuce plants to mature for harvest while we start thinking about planting more greens for fall/winter. We'll also be monitoring our watermelon vine for young fruits to start, and we'll have our first small harvest from the kiwi vines that we planted three years ago by the annex.
